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Procedure

The CITE Young Learner Anglia English Speaking Test consists of three parts and should take approximately 16 minutes to complete. There are two candidates at each session. The examination will be recorded. The recording is sent to Anglia Examinations, Chichester College for moderation.

AFTER the examination, you must not return to the area where candidates yet to take the test are still waiting.

Part One: *up to 2 minutes*

The assessor will ask each of you in turn to talk about who you are, why you are taking the examination and so on.

Part Two: *up to 6 minutes*

The assessor will ask you to talk about the topic you have been asked to prepare and then you must be prepared to answer a variety of questions in connection with the presentation.

Part Three: *up to 9 minutes*

The assessor will ask you a question/questions on a maximum of three topics. You must be prepared to engage in a discussion about the topics.

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TASK TWO: TOPIC

What are the typical errors that a pupil from your country makes? Why might this be and what is the best way to deal with them?

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TASK THREE: TOPICS

- From your own experience, how has technology changed the language classroom?
- What is the best way to deal with pupils who are disruptive?
- Describe your idea of the perfect classroom.
- What stories or games do you often use in the classroom?
- Children today do not need to learn to write by hand. Do you agree?
- What games have you used successfully in the classroom?
