A.

**(M)** Where is Amy going next Saturday? Is it the sports centre?

**(F)** No, she doesn't like sports at the moment. She never goes to the swimming pool either.

**(M)** Oh, ok.

**(F)** She's going shopping with her friend. They want to visit the new shopping centre which is next to the old cinema. They'll have a lovely day.

**(M)** Where did Fiona find her keys? She lost them last week, didn't she?

**(F)** Well, she thought they were in her bag but they weren't there. Then she looked on her desk but she couldn't see them.

**(M)** What instrument does Clare play? Is it the guitar?

**(F)** No, her friends are learning the guitar. She wanted to learn a different instrument.

**(M)** Oh right.

**(F)** Clare's learning the drums and she's really good at playing them. Her brother George plays the piano and her sister's learning the violin so it's always very noisy at their house!

**(tone)(pause 3 seconds)**

D.

**(M)** What is Jennifer going to buy Leonardo for his birthday? I know his parents are going to give him a new phone as a surprise.

**(F)** That's right and he loves playing sport so Jennifer's going to get him a new football.

(M) Wow! He'll like that!

(F) Yes, she didn't want to buy him something boring like socks. And he isn't keen on reading so she couldn't get him a book

(tone)(pause 3 seconds)

E.

(M) How do Maisie and Julie get to school? Do they walk?

(F) No, their new school is a long way from their house so they can't walk. And their mum can't drive them there because she doesn't work near the school.

(M) OK.

(F) They used to cycle to school but the roads were very busy so they stopped cycling. Now they get the bus every day.

(tone)(pause 3 seconds)

F.

(M) What's Ben cooking for dinner tonight? He makes good omelettes, doesn't he?

(F) Yes, but I hate eggs so I didn't want an omelette. He's decided to make his favourite dish because his parents are visiting. It's fish with lemon sauce.

(M) That's nice!

(F) His dad doesn't eat meat and his mum can't eat pasta so he couldn't make spaghetti.

(tone)(pause 3 seconds)

Section L2.

Listen to this passage about The Burj Khalifa and write the missing words in the spaces given. (The words in bold are those that are gapped in the exam paper. They are to be spoken clearly although not emphasised)

(tone) (pause 3 seconds)

The Burj Khalifa is an **extremely** tall building in the city of Dubai. It is the tallest tower in the **world** at over 828 metres high. Starting in 2004, it took **nearly** six years to complete the building. It has 163 floors, **57 lifts** and many shops and apartments. There is a large **lake** at the bottom of the Burg. In the evening, **crowds** of people come here to watch the light and fountain shows. These shows are amazing!

There is a team of window cleaners **who** clean the Burg by going down the outside of the building. If it is very windy, the window cleaners cannot work because it is **too** dangerous. It takes them three months to clean the building and then they **must** start again! Anyone can go up to the 124th floor. From there, they

can have views of the **whole** of the city. In the future, someone will probably **design** an even taller building!

Listen to the passage about Michael Perham and decide if the sentences are true or false. Put a tick in the correct column. There will now be a 20-second pause to allow you to read the questions.

**(tone)(pause 20 seconds)**

Michael Perham was born on 16th March 1992. As a child, he lived in Potters Bar, England, with his parents and sister. In 2007, he had his first adventure when he sailed his boat from Gibraltar to Antigua. The boat was called *Cheeky Monkey*. On finishing this journey, Michael won the world record as the youngest person to cross the Atlantic Ocean on his own. He was fourteen years and 293 days old.

Michael's next adventure, aged 17, was to sail around the world, a trip of 30,000 miles. It was very difficult for him at times. There was terrible weather in the Southern Ocean, with storms and large waves. He dreamed about eating steak and chips because the food on the boat was always cold and he didn't like it. On the positive side, he enjoyed seeing dolphins and whales swimming next to the boat. Sadly for Michael, younger people have now broken his two world records but he has continued having adventures. More recently, he has driven around the world in a small van and done more sailing.
