Section L1.

Listen to these six conversations and put a tick in the box which shows the correct answer to the man's question. The first one is done for you as an example.

A.

- (M) What time is Leo leaving home tomorrow? He needs to be in Brighton for a meeting at one thirty.
(F) That's right. He's booked a seat on the twelve-thirty train.
(M) I see. In that case, he should set off from his house at twelve as it takes him about half an hour to walk to the station.

- (M) Who's going to make the birthday cake? Is it Julie?
(F) Well, she said she wants to make biscuits. I think Gloria's good at cakes.
(M) She is, but so is Talia and Rose is actually a professional baker.
(F) Yes, but Gloria's already started it now. The party's in two days.

- (M) What does Janet do for a living? I saw her in that new clothes shop this morning. Does she work there?
(F) No. It's her sister's shop but Janet actually teaches music at the local school.
(M) Well, I didn't know that. I know she's good with children, though.

- (M) Where is Sally going to stay at the weekend? Our house is full and so is Aunt Helen's.
(F) She tried to get a room at the Lion's Gate, but all the hotels are fully booked. Fortunately, her old friend from school, Donna, has a spare room.
(M) Oh, that's lucky. Otherwise, she'd have to sleep in our caravan in the garden.

(tone) (pause 3 seconds)

E.

- (M) How did Tristan seem before his driving test? Was he nervous?
(F) Not at all. He'd had a lesson beforehand, which went well, so he was quite sure of himself.
(M) I remember before my test I was exhausted because I hadn't slept.
(F) Me too, but you know Tristan. He felt quite positive about it, and he just got on with it.

Listen to this passage about Madagascar's Wildlife and write the words which are missing in the spaces given. Remember to write two words in each space. The first one is done for you as an example.

Madagascar is the island country **located near** Southeast Africa in the Indian Ocean. Because of the island's isolation, over 80% of its plants and animals cannot be found **anywhere else** on the planet. Such unique species include the Indri Lemur and the Golden Mantella Frog. Madagascar is one of the world's twenty-five **best places** on earth for biodiversity. However, many places like this, with a wide range of animal life are at risk. These places are known as biodiversity hotspots and they **have lost** over 70% of their original habitat. For many years people have been destroying the forests. From 1950 to 1985 **at least** half of the forests in Madagascar disappeared, but local people are poor and work mainly as farmers. They have **cut down** the forests to grow crops on the land. Fortunately, wildlife protection agencies are **now working** on the island. Local people are being encouraged to prevent any **more damage** to these animals' natural homes. Some organisations are working together to save what **is left** of the forests by creating over 74,000 acres of protected land. This will be popular with tourists, which **will increase** the tourist industry and provide jobs. It will also, of course, allow the animals to grow and thrive ~~in their native habitat~~.

Listen to the passage about Michael Clark and decide if the following sentences are true or false, or if the passage doesn't say. Put a tick in the correct column. There will now be a 20-second pause to allow you to read the questions.

Michael Clark grew up in a city. He lived in a block of flats in a neighbourhood where no one had a garden. His parents worked at the weekend, so Michael and his two younger sisters never visited the countryside. Michael was a shy boy and only had one friend, Dan. When they were 10, they went with school to see a local project. Some residents had turned a piece of empty ground into a beautiful garden, just round the corner from where Michael lived. He was amazed to see the colourful flowers but he was particularly interested in the vegetables they had grown. The children were invited to help in the garden. Michael was keen to do this but Dan wasn't, so Michael went on his own. Once a month on a Saturday he went and helped with the gardening. When he left school, he went to work at a garden centre. After a year, he started going to college one day a week to get qualifications in horticulture. Now, Michael owns his own piece of land producing flowers and vegetables, which he sells to hotels in the area. He is married, with two sons, who both love gardening.
